



MYSORE, OOTY & BANDIPUR HOLIDAY

03 nights & 04 days



Itinerary:

Day 1 – Bangalore-Mysore (Distance: 145 Kms, approximate travel time: 3 hours,15 minutes by road)

Mysore (or Mysuru), a city in India's southwestern Karnataka state, was the capital of the Kingdom of Mysore from 1399 to 1947. In its centre is opulent Mysore Palace, seat of the former ruling Wodeyar dynasty. The palace blends Hindu, Islamic, Gothic and Rajput styles. Mysore is also home to the centuries-old Devaraja Market, filled with spices, silk and sandalwood.

On arrival visit Mysore Palace , Chamundeshwari Temple and KRS dam.

Overnight stay at Mysore.



Day 2 – Mysore-Ooty (Distance: 125 Kms, approximate travel time:3 hours,15 minutes by road)

This is located in the Western Ghats zone at an altitude of 2240 meters. It is the headquarters of the Nilgiri District, where the two mountain ranges meet. Udhagamandalam, popularly called as Ooty by the tourist, is the Queen of hill stations. The British started calling it as Ootacamund. Coffee and Tea Plantations and trees like Conifers, Eucalyptus, Pine and Wattle dot the hill side in Udhagamandalam and its environs.

On arrival visit Botanical garden, Ooty Lake, Doddabetta

Overnight stay at Ooty.



Day 3 – Ooty to Bandipur (Distance:48kms,1 hour 30 mins by road)

Breakfast at the hotel and proceed to Bandipur.

Bandipur National Park, an 874-sq.-km forested reserve in the southern Indian state of Karnataka, is known for its small population of tigers. Once the private hunting ground of the Maharajas of Mysore, the park also harbours Indian elephants, spotted deer, gaurs (bison), antelopes and numerous other native species. The 14th-century Himavad Gopalaswamy Temple offers views from the park's highest peak.

Overnight stay at Bandipur.



Day 4 – Bandipur –Bangalore (Distance: 233 Kms, approximate travel time :4 hours, 45 minutes by road)

Proceed back to Bangalore.
