



MYSORE, SRIRANGAPATNA, RANGANATHITTU HOLIDAY

02 nights & 03 days



Itinerary:

Day 1 – Bangalore-Mysore (Distance: 145 Kms, approximate travel time: 3 hours, 15 minutes by road)

Mysore (or Mysuru), a city in India's southwestern Karnataka state, was the capital of the Kingdom of Mysore from 1399 to 1947. In its centre is opulent Mysore Palace, seat of the former ruling Wodeyar dynasty. The palace blends Hindu, Islamic, Gothic and Rajput styles. Mysore is also home to the centuries-old Devaraja Market, filled with spices, silk and sandalwood.

Visit Mysore Palace, Chamundershwari temple, KRS

Overnight stay at Mysore.



Day 2- Mysore to Srirangapatna (Distance:24kms, approximate travel time:40 minutes by road)

Srirangapatna is an island fortress-city is of great religious, cultural and historic importance. It is nestled in the banks of river cauvery is about 3 Kms in length and 1 Km in breadth. The town derives its name from the presiding deity of Ranganatha Swamy temple situated at the western end of the island in the Cauvery River.

Visit Nimishambha temple, Daria Daulat Bagh.

Overnight stay at Mysore.



Day 3 – Mysore to Ranganathittu (Distance:18kms, approximate travel time: 35 minutes by road)

Breakfast at the hotel and proceed to Ranganathittu

Ranganathittu Bird Sanctuary is an important nesting and breeding ground for the thousands of bird species. Ranganathittu Bird Sanctuary witnesses the arrival of a large number of migratory birds of different flocks from as far as Siberia, North America and Australia.

The islands host numerous mammals and migratory birds. Some of them are Bonnet Macaque, colonies of Flying Fox and common small mammals like Indian Gray Mongoose, the monitor lizard and Civet. The Marsh Crocodile also called the Mugger Crocodile is a common inhabitant of the riverine reed beds.

Proceed to Bangalore
